Removal of Rings

You will soon notice a change in the appearance of bowls manufactured from January 2017 onwards. A law change has been implemented by World Bowls to remove the requirement for bowls to have large rings on the non-bias side of a bowl.

This change will allow for manufacturers to customise the size of distinguishing marks on the non-bias side of the bowl.

Players are advised that the new law changes regarding rings on bowls do not affect law 52.1.8. (stickers). Stickers are still required to be placed on both sides.

Rule(s) Of The Month

In a recent game an end was started as usual with the delivery of the jack followed by the leaders first bowl. At this point it was noted that the mat had not been placed on the rink centre line and consequently the jack at been bowled down the wrong line. In a typically correct decision by the officiating PBBC umpire of the day, the ruling was that the mat had to be moved immediately across to the centre line but the jack was to stay where it lay. The relevant rules;

6.2.3 If the mat is off the centre line it must be moved to that line

9.7 After the first player to play has delivered the first bowl, no-one has the right to challenge the legality of the original position of the jack.

What if it is very hot on Saturdays?

If the temperature for Adelaide on the Bureau of Meteorology website (www.bom.gov.au) at 4.30pm on Thursday is forecast to be 38 degrees Celsius or above for Saturday, all games will be played with practice ends commencing at 9.15am.

However, If the Thursday forecast temperature for Saturday is below 38 degrees but increases to be 38 degrees or above at 7:30 am on the day of play (Saturday) then all Premier League & Division 1 - 4 matches will be played on the following Friday night. 
Thought For The Month

Rowley Park..The Place Where The Champions Gathered


