### Quote Of The Month

One of our recent retirees, **Paul Malcolm**, was a welcome and regular contributor to this newsletter. Unfortunately Paul was not able to go around again this year and has had to pack away his bowls for the last time. As a former rocket scientist Paul has a mind that lends itself to physics and mathematics. He has passed on a very scientific analysis of a bowl in motion covering a range of related issues. Some of the formulae is beyond the layman but here is an excerpt on the subject of bowl skid and deceleration which is almost understandable to the non PHD. Believe it or not.

*How far does a bowl skid on delivery? Assuming the average coefficient of friction is determined as 0.6 then the skid is about 4 feet (120cm) with a delivery velocity of 15 feet (4.5 metres) per second. Naturally the linear velocity of the bowl is reduced by its skidding. Testing has shown that initial velocity of the bowl is reduced by its skidding. Testing has shown that initial velocity (V) is reduced to 5/7 (V) when the bowl is fully rotational. On a full size green a fast driver delivers at 33 feet (10 mtrs) per second, in which case the bowl would skid for about 8 foot (240cm). Did you get all that?*
