***Lawn Bowling and Golf Putting Similarities***

As a former golfer taking up bowls I found myself adopting many of the techniques and thought processes I applied to putting. To confirm this approach I recall reading "Putting Out Of Your Mind" by sports psychologist Dr Bob Rotella. I have listed a few of his tips below. What do you think?

- Devotion to an unvarying routine is one of the hallmarks of a good putter
- Your first impression of how a putt will break will be right more often than any other impression you might form
- In putting, the inability to forget is infinitely more devastating than the ability to remember. There is nothing worse than dwelling on the putt you have missed.
- The smaller the target you have, the better the brain and body can function in getting the ball there.
- Thinking the way you have always thought will almost certainly assure that you putt the way you have always putted

# What does it take to be a good Leader?

- Should you be leading because you cannot fill any other team spot?
- Should you be called on to draw a resting toucher with every bowl?
- Should you be ideally aged under 30? Should you be Leader, but if you play well, be promoted to Second next week?

These are but a few of the myths, which surround the position of Leader.

If you wish to be a good leader, consider the following points.

One of the main factors in successful team play is compatibility. The leader as a team member must be able to get on well with their team mates. A good leader will give encouragement to each player in the team. This not only promotes confidence in each member, but also helps players concentrate harder as they are involved all the time, with the action on their own rink.

Always try to do what your skipper asks of you and do not show dissent on the bowling rink. A good Leader, in fact a good team member, having played their bowls, does not then spend time wondering what is going on next door.

There is nothing more annoying in a team game to see a bowler who has delivered their bowls, chatting to members of another rink or standing watching what is happening in another game.

The Leader's first duty is to place the mat and deliver the jack to the length required by the skipper.

Always pay attention to your skipper at the completion of an end so you know where the mat is to be placed

Next, attempt to place your two bowls as close to the jack as possible, if not, at least in the scoring zone that may be used by players following.

The scoring zone is an area no more than 30cm in front of the jack on either side, or no more than 75cm behind within an area 30cm wide either side of the jack.

While many skippers expect every Leader's bowl to be on the jack, many will see the value of having bowls in the scoring zone. Some will argue that a short bowl is useless, however a bowl within 30cm of the jack on either hand can be used, or promoted.

Likewise, a bowl behind the head in the scoring zone is a good covering bowl and will be in the count should the jack be moved back.

This will be achieved by constantly practicing the draw shot.

If every Leader placed their bowl in this area, they would make it very easy for their team-mates following..

The biggest fault in many Leaders is that they must try to draw a flat toucher with every bowl, hence many times they finish up a metre short of the head causing problems for those following.

Short bowls in the draw cause immense problems for the bowlers following. Also, if the head is moved later in the game, the jack will rarely come forward.

So Leaders, give your team a chance by reaching the scoring zone with your bowls, to give the players following, a chance to build a successful head to score from.

If you are enthusiastic and strive to carry out your role as Leader with confidence, you will build team spirit by inspiring those who bowl after you, to do equally as well.
