



RALPH DUNN The Footballer

We all know that at age 85 Ralph Dunn plays a pretty fair game of bowls. He picked up two pennant badges last season and still features in club championship events.


Ralph has been a sportsman all his life. How many of you know that nearly 70 years ago he was emerging as one of South Australia's best footballers. He played in North Adelaide's U17 and U18 premiership teams in 1947,48. He then played for Kilburn for a few years. When he won the association B&F he was lured back to the mighty Roosters where he played his first senior game in 1954. He became a regular playing with and against some of the league's all time greats. Competing alongside the likes of McCann, Stringer, Lindner, Bunton Jnr, etc. must have been a dream come true.

State wingman, Ken Eglington (Westies) in a newspaper article described Ralph as the best player he had stood. In Ralph's words "that was quite a wrap". Tragically his league career was cut short in 1956 with a knee injury sustained at Kensington Oval. Two operations failed to restore full functionality but Ralph was not to be denied and returned to Kilburn where he "played for years on one leg".

Still a very good player Ralph won another association medal and was a part of Kilburn's golden era, at one stage winning 42 consecutive games culminating in the 1960 Amateur League A1 premiership. He returned to the Roosters as a committeeman and was serving in this capacity when they won the 1971 Champion of Australia title beating Carlton in the final.

Ralph kindly lent your editor his precious scrapbook from which this information was gleaned. I also scanned his photos, some of which you will find on the last page.
